## CEO Perspectives – Reforming Goals, Transforming Business Models and Performing Green Economy

With the increasing emphasis on SDGs by prospective corporate leaders, Aloke Lohia, Founder and Group Chief Executive Officer, Indorama Ventures PCL, Belinda Wong, Chairwoman and Chief Executive Officer, Starbucks China, and Ronald Lu, Founder and Chairman of Ronald Lu & Partners, revisited their business approaches and reiterated the importance of embedding sustainability at the organization's core. Lohia claimed that businesses should create quality and eco-friendly products, with the goal of ensuring that one-third of the future raw materials are degradable and renewable. Wong explained Starbucks' purpose-driven growth agenda and expressed her passion for inspiring other industries to jointly advance sustainability. Lu introduced eco-friendly architectural designs and stressed sustainability mindsets groomed from early education.

## Accelerating Socio-economic Progress by Crowdsourcing and Dynamic Knowledge Acquisition, while Thriving with Technology

The harmonious coexistence between humanity and nature is deeply ingrained in Asian culture. With the moderation by Professor Christine Loh, Chief Development Strategist, Institute for the Environment of the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, Khunying Kalaya Sophonpanich, Deputy Minister of Education, Thailand, Lu Zhi, Professor, School of Life Sciences & Institute of Ecology, Executive Director, Center for Nature and Society, Peking University, and David Wei, Chairman and Founding Partner, Vision Knight Capital delved into the relationship between climate challenges and biodiversity, forecasting the socio-economic outlook. Lu shared China's gradual elimination of plant exploitation and pointed out that the threat of dwindling biodiversity deserves more attention. Moving to policymaking, Sophonpanich spoke about the Thai community's mitigation of water shortage and retention of biodiversity through reviving forests, engaging in field studies and educational courses, eventually multiplying the villager's yield and income. Wei suggested that understanding our surroundings to push forward ESG policies, as the more we learn, the clearer we know where our roles lie in.

Moderated by **Chetwyn Chan**, Vice President (Research and Development) and Peter T. C. Lee Chair Professor of Psychology, The Education University of Hong Kong, "The Future of Work" panel highlighted the increasing demand for digital-savvy critical thinkers at workplace. **Helen Meng**, Patrick Huen Wing Ming Professor of Systems Engineering and Engineering Management (SEEM), the Chinese University of Hong Kong, shared her plan in simplifying Al-related courses to promote technical knowledge among adolescents. **Tommie Lo**, Founder and Chief Executive Officer of Preface, added that we should persist in dynamic lifelong learning and thrive with the latest technologies. **Tuan Q Phan**, Associate Professor of Marketing, Innovation & Information Management, the University of Hong Kong Business School, believes that technological intelligence, creativity, interpersonal skills, and resilience are essential in the future workforce.

### Pioneering Sustainable Fashion through China's Natural Dye, Heritage Preservation, and Innovations

With extensive knowledge in Natural dye – the ancient technique with over 3000 years of heritage, **Wang Qiong**, Senior Experimenter and Team Leader of the Plant Dyeing Team, Institute of Botany, Jiangsu Province and Chinese Academy of Sciences, and **Zhou Liming**, R&D Director of Esquel Group, shared their optimism towards natural dye blooming across industries. Despite natural dye's unstable production and need for delicate care, Zhou highlighted that Esquel remains committed to applying and improving this technique. Wang also supported using Chinese plant dye as it is degradable throughout its life cycle. The dialog closed with a tour around Integral's Natural Dye Garden and an "Indigo Tie-Dye" workshop, providing guests with an immersive experience in understanding plant features and dyeing processes.

Facilitated by Herman Chan, Director of Symmpix at Tessellation Group, a conversation was held to discuss the relationship between preserving traditional craftsmanship and technological advancements in achieving sustainable fashion. Radhikaraje Gaekwad, Vice President of Maharani Chimnabai Stree Udyogalaya, Trustee of Maharaja Fateh Singh Museum, shared that delicate royal textiles and handicrafts of her home are produced sustainably and locally, whereas mass production provides larger quantities but oversimplified craftsmanship. Edwin Keh, Chief Executive Officer of the Hong Kong Research Institute of Textiles and Apparel, suggested that clothing sales and production should focus more on durability, market adaptation and technological advancements.
